CONCEPT NOTE

Background

The European Commission's (EC) Service for Foreign Policy Instruments (FPI) and the European External Action Service's (EEAS) Directorate for the Integrated Approach for Security and Peace (ISP) are currently preparing the Annual Action Programme (AAP) 2023¹ for the <u>Neighbourhood Development and</u> <u>International Cooperation Instrument – Global Europe (NDICI-GE) Thematic Programme on Peace Stability and Conflict Prevention (TP on PS&CP)</u>. In this context, they have asked the European Peacebuilding Liaison Office (EPLO) to organise a <u>Civil Society Dialogue Network (CSDN) Funding</u> <u>Instruments Meeting (FIM)</u> in order to gather civil society input into the process.

Objectives

The overall objective of this meeting is to gather input from representatives of civil society organisations (CSOs) and other actors in order to contribute to reflections on the drafting of the AAP 2023 for the NDICI-GE TP on PS&CP.

It will also provide CSO representatives and other actors with opportunities to ask questions about the implementation of the NDICI-GE TP on PS&CP to the EC and EEAS officials who are responsible for it.

Format

The meeting will take place over two days on the Zoom platform. The first day will consist of a single plenary session and the second day will consist of a combination of plenary sessions and small group discussions.
