CONCEPT NOTE

Background

The <u>Regulation establishing the Neighbourhood Development and International Cooperation Instrument –</u> <u>Global Europe (NDICI-GE)</u> was adopted in June 2021 and the <u>Multiannual Indicative Programme (MIP)</u> <u>2021-2027 for the Thematic Programme on Peace Stability and Conflict Prevention (TP on PS&CP)</u> was adopted in December 2021.

The European Commission's (EC) Service for Foreign Policy Instruments (FPI) and the EEAS' Directorate for the Integrated Approach for Security and Peace (ISP) are currently preparing the <u>Annual Action</u> <u>Programme</u> (AAP) 2022 for the TP on PS&CP. In this context, they have asked the European Peacebuilding Liaison Office (EPLO) to organise a <u>Civil Society Dialogue Network (CSDN) Funding</u> <u>Instruments Meeting (FIM)</u> in order to gather civil society input into the process.

Objectives

The overall objective of this meeting is to gather input from representatives of civil society organisations (CSOs) and other actors in order to contribute to reflections on the drafting of the AAP 2022 for the NDICI-GE TP on PS&CP.

It will also provide CSO representatives and other actors to ask questions about the implementation of the NDICI-GE TP on PS&CP to the EC officials who are responsible for it.

Format

The meeting will take place over two days on the Zoom platform. The first day will consist of a single plenary session and the second day will consist of a combination of plenary sessions and small group discussions.

Participants

The meeting will bring together up to 100 participants, including representatives of CSOs, international organisations and EU Member States' (MS) implementing agencies, and officials from both the EC (Directorate-General for International Partnerships (DG INTPA), DG for Neighbourhood and Enlargement Negotiations (DG NEAR) and FPI) and the EEAS.

Language

The meeting will be held in English.
