Informal consultation on strategic programming 2021-2027

CONCEPT NOTE

Background

The Council of the EU, the European Commission (EC) and the European Parliament (EP) are currently negotiating the text of the draft <u>Regulation establishing the Neighbourhood Development and</u> <u>International Cooperation Instrument (NDICI)</u> (and its accompanying <u>annexes</u>) which should replace various EU external financing instruments (EFIs) when they expire at the end of 2020.

One of the EFIs which should be incorporated into the NDICI is the <u>Instrument contributing to Stability</u> <u>and Peace (IcSP)</u>. According to the EC's 2018 proposal for the NDICI, the three components of the IcSP¹ should be divided between the programmable 'Thematic Programmes' and the non-programmable 'Rapid Response Actions' pillars, and 'Security, Stability and Peace' should be an area of co-operation under the 'Geographic Programmes' pillar.

The EC's Service for Foreign Policy Instruments (FPI) and the EEAS' Directorate for the Integrated Approach for Security and Peace (ISP) have asked the European Peacebuilding Liaison Office (EPLO) to organise a <u>Civil Society Dialogue Network (CSDN) Funding Instruments Meeting (FIM)</u> on the future programming of the NDICI Thematic Programme on 'Peace, Stability and Conflict Prevention'.

Objectives

The overall objective of this meeting is to gather input from representatives of civil society organisations (CSOs) and other actors in order to contribute to reflections on the strategic programming of the NDICI Thematic Programme on 'Peace, Stability and Conflict Prevention' 2021-2027.

Format

The meeting will take place over two days on the Zoom platform. The first day will consist of a single plenary session (maximum two hours) and the second day will consist of a combination of plenary sessions and small group discussions (maximum 90 minutes).

Participants

The meeting will bring together up to 100 participants, including representatives of CSOs, international organisations and EU Member States' (MS) implementing agencies, and officials from the EC (Directorate-General for International Cooperation and Development (DG DEVCO), Directorate-General for Neighbourhood and Enlargement Negotiations (DG NEAR) and FPI) and the EEAS.

Language

The meeting will be held in English.

¹ Assistance in response to situations of crisis or emerging crisis to prevent conflicts (Article 3); Assistance for conflict prevention, peace-building and crisis preparedness (Article 4); and Assistance in addressing global and trans-regional threats and emerging threats(Article 5)
