Training Seminar: 'Peacebuilding Advocacy towards the EU'

Agenda

The European Peacebuilding Liaison Office (EPLO) has been running training seminars as part of the Civil Society Dialogue Network (CSDN) for many years. This year's edition, like the two preceding ones, will take place as an interactive online seminar.

The objectives are to:

- Increase participants' capacity to influence the EU in conflict prevention/peacebuilding (CPPB) through understanding EU processes, mechanisms and entry points;
- Increase participants' capacities to design and implement an effective EU advocacy strategy/plan for their work;
- Promote networking, exchange between participants, EPLO staff, EU officials.

Places are limited and participants are expected to participate in all five sessions, which are each 90 minutes long. The online seminar uses a range of software and techniques to ensure interaction between participants, resource people and speakers. No prior experience of the software is necessary. Participants will be sent course material to read in preparation for the seminar.
