

Peace, Stability and Conflict Prevention in the NDICI

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Peace and Security is addressed under all three pillars:

NDICI

Geographic

Thematic

The geographic pillar covers cooperation priorities, including **root causes of insecurity** such as social cohesion, gender discrimination, lack of basic services, etc. and used to **build resilience** of States, communities and individuals at local, national and regional levels.

The thematic programme on Peace, Stability and Conflict Prevention will provide assistance to and build capacities for conflict prevention, peacebuilding, crisis preparedness and response, and also support initiatives aiming at addressing global, transregional and emerging threats.

Rapid Response

The rapid response pillar covers responses to **existing or emerging** situations of **crisis or conflict**.



Peace and Security under the NDICI needs to:

- 1) Ensure complementarity across the three pillars (geographic, thematic, rapid response);
- 2) Ensure complementarity with other financial instruments
- 3) Ensure complementarity with non-financial instruments (e.g. CSDP missions and operations/JHA agencies);



Geographic pillar

General principles and focus:

- Providing long-term support for addressing root causes, strengthen prevention, capacity building and resilience building
- Providing support to UN or regional peace and security initiatives with a clear national or regional focus
- Develop conflict sensitive and resilience-based approach
- Facilitated by Conflict Analysis for fragile countries new NDICI requirement (Art. 10.2)
- Consider the Humanitarian-Development-Peace nexus



Thematic programme on Peace, Stability and Conflict Prevention. General principles and focus:

- Focus on actions that have a specific added value to be carried at global and trans-regional level.
- Actions that can be undertaken even if they were not identified as a priority sector with partner country governments.
- Possibility of Capacity Building for Development and Security & Development (CBDSD) actions.



Topics addressed horizontally across the thematic programme:

- Respect for democratic principles, the rule of law, good governance, human rights, international humanitarian law and gender equality
- Inclusive and partnership based approaches to promote stability and peace, including the Women Peace and Security and the Youth Peace and Security agendas
- The Climate–Security nexus, which should address the impact of climate change on peace and security
- Fostering resilience and innovation directly contributing to peace and stability efforts
- Support for Multilateralism



Ensures continuity of former IcSP Art. 4 and Art. 5 type of actions.

Two priority areas: (1) providing assistance to and build capacities for conflict prevention, peacebuilding, crisis preparedness and response; and (2) supporting initiatives aiming at addressing global, trans-regional and emerging threats.

I. Conflict prevention, Crisis preparedness and Peacebuilding:

1) Analytical tools to detect early signs of conflicts, monitor dynamics and mechanisms to curb use of natural resources to finance conflicts;

2) Confidence building, mediation, dialogue and reconciliation;

3) Support to peace processes, stabilisation and peacebuilding



II. Global threats:

- Based on updated needs analysis, continue work started under Article 5 of the IcSP;
- Partnership with multilateral and international organisations and strengthening EU role and policies in the multilateral fora;
- Set general security frameworks to give added value to related actions under the geographical programme;
- Stress Rule of Law as enabler of reform process and key element of actions against Counter terrorism, Organised Crime, Cyber Security and CBRN Risk mitigation.



II. Global threats:

- Policy driven approach; strategic and political guidance as important source for the thematic initiatives.
- Focus on horizontal and trans regional security issues.
- Flexibility for emergent threats
- Prevention of Violent Extremism to be streamlined, as appropriate, in all programming.
