# Mental Health and Psycho-Social Support in Transitional Justice: Gathering Input from Experts

## **Concept Note**

## **Background**

Mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) is increasingly recognised at the international level as a key component for a holistic approach to Transitional Justice (TJ). A number of EU policies and strategies recognise the importance of MHPSS in contributing to a people-centric approach to security and building peace. These include the 2021 <u>Strategic approach in support of Disarmament, Demobilisation, and Reintegration of former combatants</u>, and the <u>EEAS Peace Mediation Guidelines</u>, which feature a specific chapter on psychosocial dimensions.

MHPSS in TJ processes were also identified among the priority issues for the 2024 Annual Action Plans on Peace, Stability and Conflict Prevention under the Neighbourhood Development and International Cooperation Instrument (NDICI) – Global Europe funding instrument.

While there is growing global consensus on the need to integrate MHPSS in TJ, there are many questions around what that means in practice, how practitioners can overcome the challenges they face, and the ways in which policymakers and donors can best support the meaningful integration of MHPSS in TJ.

In this context, the European Peacebuilding Liaison Office (EPLO), in cooperation with the European External Action Service (EEAS), the European Commission (EC), and the <u>Facility on Justice in Conflict and Transition</u>, is organising a Civil Society Dialogue Network Policy Meeting on MHPSS and TJ, which will take place on Friday 26 January 2024, in the wake of the 2024 Basel Peace Forum. Participants are invited to share their insights based on their experiences of MHPSS initiatives in TJ contexts.

#### **Objective**

The objective of this CSDN policy meeting is to gather input and analysis from civil society experts on future EU efforts in further integrating mental health and psycho-social support in transitional justice processes. This meeting will directly contribute to the creation of a set of operational guidelines for the EU.

More specifically, the discussions will reflect on:

- The relationship between the fields of MHPSS and TJ.
- Concrete examples of implementation of MHPSS approaches in TJ contexts.
- Challenges, tensions and complementarities in linking MHPSS and TJ approaches.

• How donors can support the integration of MHPSS in TJ.

### **Participants**

The meeting will bring together the Facility's experts and a number of civil society experts from the TJ and MHPSS field.

#### **Format**

The meeting will take the form of a one-day facilitated round-table discussion under the Chatham House Rule<sup>1</sup>. The discussions will be held in English.

## **Output**

A meeting report including the key recommendations and summary of the discussions will be published.

## **Civil Society Dialogue Network**

The Civil Society Dialogue Network (CSDN) is a mechanism for dialogue between civil society and EU policy-makers on issues related to peace and conflict. It is co-financed by the European Union (Neighbourhood Development and International Cooperation Instrument – Global Europe). It is managed by the European Peacebuilding Liaison Office (EPLO), a civil society network, in co-operation with the European Commission (EC) and the European External Action Service (EEAS).
