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EU Update: November 2024

Council of the EU

The Foreign Affairs Council (FAC) met on 18 November in Brussels. EU Foreign Affairs ministers <u>discussed</u> Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine, the situation in the Middle East, EU-US relations, Georgia, and the Horn of Africa. They also <u>adopted sanctions</u> in view of Iran's military support to Russia.

The FAC also met in its defence configuration on 19 November. EU Defence ministers <u>adopted conclusions</u> on the **Permanent Structured Cooperation (PESCO)** strategic review, and <u>discussed</u> EU support to **Ukraine**, and defence readiness and preparedness.

In November, the Council also approved a series of assistance measures under the **European Peace Facility (EPF)**:

- Support to the <u>Egyptian Armed Forces</u> (€20 million)
- Support to the navy of the Republic of the Congo (€5 million)
- Top up to support to <u>Rwanda Defence Force</u> active in Northern Mozambique (€20 million)
- Support to the <u>Jordanian Armed Forces</u> (€13.5 million)

Common Security and Defence Policy

On 15 November, the Council adopted a <u>decision</u> extending the mandate of the EU Military Assistance Mission in support of Ukraine (**EUMAM Ukraine**) until 15 November 2026.

EU Special Representative

On 18 November, the Council <u>appointed</u> João Cravinho as **EU Special Representative** (**EUSR**) for the **Sahel region**. Mr Cravinho served as Minister of Foreign Affairs of Portugal from 2022 to 2024.

European Parliament

The European Parliament held plenary sessions on 13-14 November in Brussels, and 25-28 November in Strasbourg. MEPs adopted resolution on EU action against the **Russian shadow fleets** and ensuring a full enforcement of sanctions against Russia, **Hong Kong**, repression of women in **Iran**, the shrinking space for civil society in **Cambodia**, **Georgia**'s worsening democratic crisis, and **EU support to Ukraine**.
